And if that doesn't get your knees knocking then brave the new Scarab-Bouncers and be catapulted nearly 15 feet up in the air in an indoor ride that transports you into another dimension, with the sights and sounds of ancient Egypt.

As well as the opening of Kingdom of the Pharaohs, 2009 sees the return of a much-missed favourite to LEGOLAND Windsor; the hi-tech revamped Rocket Racers where you can design your very own virtual racing driver and car to your own specification before taking on the opposition in purpose built racing pods.
